- **Submission Types:** Original research articles, critical reviews, commentaries, case studies, policy briefs, and innovative practice reports are welcome.
- **Manuscript Length:** Manuscripts should generally be between 5,000 and 8,000 words, excluding references.
 - Original research manuscripts should generally be between 5,000 and 8,000 words, excluding references.
 - Action research, self-reflection manuscripts should generally be between
 4,000 and 7,000 words, excluding references.
 - Reflective commentaries, innovative practice reports should generally be between 2,500 and 5,000 words, reference are not expected
- **Formatting:** Please use APA 7th Edition formatting and adhere to the *Issues in Teacher Education* author guidelines, which can be found on the journal website.
- Submission Deadline: April 1, 2025 Extended to May 15, 2025
- **Electronic Submission:** All submissions must be made electronically through the online submission system on the journal website with a note that the submission is for the clinical practice special issue.
